A new way to sort waste

From Monday 1 August, food waste will be collected in your green-lidded kerbside waste bin, which is now called your **Food Organics and Garden Organics (FOGO) bin.** Your bin collection days and frequencies will also be changing so we can collect your food waste more often.

Using this information

This brochure is one part of a kit we've delivered to you. The kit contains all the information you need to make the switch to the new waste system, including:

- A benchtop caddy and some sample compostable liners to help you collect cooking scraps;
- This brochure with information about what to put in each of your kerbside bins from 1 August;
- A card containing quick-reference information about collection dates and sorting; and
- A magnet to attach the card to your fridge.

For most households, we've also swapped your 120-litre recycling bin for a larger 240-litre bin.

Sorting your waste

Contamination can cause recycling and organic waste to be sent to landfill, so it's important to sort waste correctly. We know Borough residents work hard to put the right items in the right bin, so this brochure contains a detailed guide on the new way to sort waste. You can also download our Borough Bins app or visit our website to search a list of items and sort them correctly.

Making the switch

Week 1: Starting Monday 1 August Start sorting your waste in the new way using the information in this brochure.

New bin collection schedules start this week. Your green-lidded FOGO bin will be collected every week, and your red-lidded landfill bin and yellow-lidded recycling bin will be collected on alternating fortnights.

Your bins will be collected on the same day of the week. This day is the same day your landfill and recycling bins are currently collected. You can check this day on the Borough Bins app or by visiting Council's website at queenscliffe.vic.gov.au/bins.

In this first week, your landfill bin will be collected on your normal collection day. Your FOGO bin will also be collected on this day. Your recycling bin will not be collected.

Week 2: Starting Monday 8 August

In this second week, your recycling bin will be collected on your normal collection day. Your FOGO bin will also be collected on this day. Your landfill bin will not be collected.

Ongoing

Keep putting your FOGO bin out every week, and your landfill and recycling bins out on alternating fortnights. You will be putting two bins out every week from now on.

FOGO bin

(240L green-lidded bin)



About this bin Your green-lidded bin is now a Food Organics and Garden Organics (FOGO) bin. In addition to the green garden waste you already put in this bin, from Monday 1 August, you'll be putting food waste in this bin too.

When to put this bin out

This bin will be collected **every week** on the same day of the week as your landfill and recycling bins. There will be no Friday bin collection.

Recycling bin

(240L yellow-lidded bin)



About this bin

Keep using your yellow-lidded recycling bin for all your recyclables. Most households will automatically receive a bigger 240L bin from us so you can recycle just as much when we switch to fortnightly recycling collection.

When to put this bin out

This bin will be collected every fortnight on your usual collection day, alternating with your red-lidded landfill bin.

Your first fortnightly collection will be on the week beginning 8 August (there will be no recycling collection on the week beginning 1 August).

What to put in this bin



Empty, rigid plastics numbered 1, 2 or 5*, including:

- Berry punnets
- Biscuit trays
- ✓ Clear plastic meat Clear plastic meat

- Milk and other plastic drink bottles

*Check the bottom of plastic items for a triangle containing this number. Plastic recycling should be larger than a credit card – put smaller plastics (like lids) in the landfill bin.

Paper and cardboard, including:

- ✓ Boxes
- Egg cartons
- Envelopes (leave clear windows in)
- ✓ Junk mail

- ✓ Magazines
- Newspapers
- ✓ Pizza boxes (only the parts without grease)

Metals, including:

- Aerosol cans (empty)
- ✓ Aluminium foil (golf ball sized or larger)
- ✓ Aluminium foil trays (rinsed clean)
- ✓ Drink cans
- ✓ Metal jar lids
- ✓ Tins and cans

Glass, including:

- ✓ Beer bottles‡
- Champagne bottles‡
- Cosmetic jars and bottles (clean)

‡Remove lids from glass bottles. Heavy magnetic lids (typically from beer bottles) can be placed in the recycling. Thin aluminium lids and corks go in your landfill bin.

Landfill bin (120L red-lidded bin)



About this bin

Your landfill bin is where rubbish goes when it can't be recycled or composted.

When to put this bin out

This bin will be collected every fortnight on your usual collection day, alternating with your yellow-lidded recycling bin.

Your first fortnightly collection will be on the week beginning 1 August.

Benchtop caddy



About the caddy

Keep this caddy on your benchtop. Fill it with food waste as you prepare food, and empty it into your green-lidded FOGO bin every couple of days or as needed.

The caddy stays inside

Don't place this caddy on the kerb. Empty it into your green-lidded FOGO bin and return it to your kitchen bench.

Just like your kerbside bins, the caddy is the property of Council. Leave the caddy at your property if you move out or sell your house.

Using a liner

Using liners is optional – you can simply rinse the caddy after each use. If you choose to use liners, they must be certified compostable liners. Look for the Australian Standard 'AS 4736' logo on liner packaging.

Plastic bags are not accepted, even those labelled 'biodegradable.'

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
