ALI MOORE Forum Host

Ali Moore has more than 30 years' experience as a journalist and broadcaster, working for the Australian Broadcasting Corporation, Australia's Nine Network, and for the BBC's global news network, based in Singapore. She has covered major news and current affairs events across the region, including as the ABC's China Correspondent in Beijing.

Ali is a former Vice-Chancellor's Fellow at the University of Melbourne, producing and presenting the 'This is Not A Drill' series of hypotheticals with Asialink, the ABC and the Wheeler Centre. Now a freelance broadcaster and journalist, Ali is a regular host on ABC Radio Melbourne.

Jacinta is currently Deputy Premier in the Andrews Labor Government.

Adnyamathanha Woman, G21 First Nations Pillar Chair, Co-Founder & Director of Arranyinha P/L

Proud Adnyamathanha Woman, Marsha Uppill was appointed in 2022 as the Inaugural Chair of G21's First Nations Pillar. Her life's journey guides her current and future direction as she advocates and works towards generational change for First Nations peoples and our collective communities.

She has more than 30 years' experience in state and local government, alongside federal government and with industry, education and community organisations. Marsha is also a Board Member of Short Black Opera and Reconciliation Advisor to Cotton On Group.





MATT STOKES

Larrakia Man, Managing Director, Larrakia Bilirra Group and former AFL champion and Cats premiership player

Matt Stokes is a Larrakia Man who grew up in Darwin. He is a dual premership player and Managing Director of Larrakia Bilirra Group, a leading Indigenous Infrastructure Services Company providing a range of services to government and private clients across Australia.

Matt's long term vision is to create a welcoming and empowering working environment, creating job opportunities for Indigenous people, and ensuring they always feel safe and secure.

CORRINA ECCLES Wadawurrung Woman, Cultural Strengthening General Manager, Wadawurrung TOAC

Corrina Eccles is a proud Wadawurrung woman living and working on Wadawurrung Country in Djilang and across the Surf Coast and Bellawiyn.

Corrina is Cultural Strengthening General Manager for the Wadawurrung Traditional Owners Aboriginal Corporation (WTOAC) and has over 25 years of employment experience in Aboriginal organisations in the region.

Corrina is a Board Director or Committee Member for various organisations, including Barwon Water, The Gordon TAFE, Barwon Regional Partnerships Advisory Committee, Geelong Football Club, and the Bells Beach Advisory Committee, Deakin University and G21 First Nations Pillar.







JODIE SIZER

Djap Wurrung/Gunditjmara Woman and Chief Executive Officer, Great Ocean Road Authority

Jodie Sizer is a Djab Wurrung, Gunditjmara Woman and one of Australia's foremost Indigenous leaders. She is inaugural CEO of the Great Ocean Road Coast and Parks Authority, and has dedicated decades to driving meaningful change in Indigenous communities.

She was inducted to the Victorian Honour Roll of Women, received the Prime Minister's Centenary Medal for her contribution to Australian society and has been listed as one of the 100 Women of Influence in the Australian Financial Review.

Jodie is qualified as a Certified Practising Accountant (CPA), is Chair of the Australian Institute of Aboriginal Torres Strait Islander Studies, a director of the Ebony Institute, and the Vice-President of the Collingwood Football Club.

PROFESSOR MARK ROSE Gunditjmara Man and Pro Vice-Chancellor, Indigenous Strategy at Deakin University

Mark Rose is an Aboriginal Man traditionally linked to the Gunditjmara Nation of western Victoria. With a forty-year career in education, Mark has contributed to a broad range of educational settings in Victoria, nationally and internationally. He has served on five ministerial advisory committees and co-chaired the Victorian Implementation Review of Royal Commission into Aboriginal Deaths in Custody.

For six years, Mark held the Chancellor position at Batchelor Institute of Indigenous Education Darwin where he oversaw Indigenous education engagement with Timor. In the last 15 years, Mark has held senior academic positions and in 2020 he became the inaugural Pro Vice-Chancellor Indigenous Strategy and Innovation at Deakin University.

Betsy is guiding development of G21's updated 2050 Region Plan.

The first G21 Plan in 2006 was unique in Australia. It was developed collaboratively by the people of the region to define opportunities, tackle barriers and set a long-term vision.

Much has changed since 2006. Climate change, First Nations and massive population growth were missing from the original plan, all of which will be included in the refreshed version.



The research process includes a region-wide survey, with the new Plan to be finalised by the end of 2023.
