COUNCIL INVITES COMMUNITY FEEDBACK ON DRAFT DOCUMENTS

Council has released four draft documents for public exhibition, open until 4:00 pm Tuesday, 14 October.

This is an opportunity for community members to review the documents and provide feedback to help shape Council's future planning and decision-making.

The following draft documents are currently on exhibition and open for public submissions:

- Draft Council Plan 2025-2029
- Draft Financial Plan 2025-2035
- Draft Asset Plan 2025–2035 (including supporting documents)
- Draft Municipal Public Health and Wellbeing Strategy 2025–2029

OFF-LEASH DOG AREA SURVEY

In response to strong community interest, Council is exploring possible locations for a dedicated off-leash dog area, and we'd love to hear your thoughts!




BUSH AND BEACH DISCOVERY AT ROYAL PARK
