Local knowledge is a win for Sport Precinct upgrade

Council's upgrade of the Queenscliff Sport and Recreation Precinct is on track for completion in April 2018 with local contractor John Monahan Pty Ltd at the helm.

The successful civil works appointee took formal possession of the site on Tuesday 12 December 2017, and site fencing, clearing and construction in preparation for the construction works quickly followed.

The State Government has provided funding of \$3.15 million for Council's upgrade of the Sport and Recreation precinct. Member for Bellarine Lisa Neville on visiting the site with Borough of Queenscliffe Mayor, Cr Susan Salter said that the "multi-million dollar funding for the project was delivery of a 2014 election commitment and that it was great to see works underway."

"I was very pleased to have secured State Government funding for this important project and now, having worked with local sporting clubs and Council on its development, I look forward to those clubs and their members soon playing on the first class facilities they deserve," Ms Neville said.

"When completed I know the upgraded sports precinct will provide a great community asset that will serve the community of Queenscliff well for many years to come," Ms Neville said.

"Council is so pleased to be able to offer the contract for the civil construction works at the Sport Precinct to a local operator and reinvest the project funding into a Borough business, as well as Borough infrastructure," said the Mayor, Councillor Susan Salter.

"This appointment aligns with Council's updated Procurement Policy and the recently endorsed Economic Development Strategy, and represents value for money for Council."

"But apart from that, the value of appointing a business whose staff are longstanding supporters and users of the sporting clubs, with entrenched knowledge of the site, is unquantifiable. This is a real win for our community."

"Because of the commitment of the State Government, Council will be able to provide the members of our sporting clubs and their supporters with vastly improved facilities. I look forward to seeing netball played on the new courts at the start of the season," said Cr Salter.

The \$3.15 million funding for the upgrade of the Sport and Recreation precinct has been provided under the Victorian Government's Community Sports Infrastructure Fund.

At the completion of the project the precinct will feature new netball courts and cricket nets, more than 90 new car parking spaces with accompanying roadway, kerbing and footpaths, a new playground and refreshed landscaping. The schedule of works also includes the construction of an improved retaining wall to the rear of the Monahan Centre and installation of underground utility services.

Transition to LED street lighting underway

The transition to light-emitting diode (LED) street lighting throughout the Borough of Queenscliffe commenced in December 2017 with Powercor installing new street lights in Point Lonsdale. It is anticipated that all installations will be completed by mid-February 2018.

Council resolved to transition to LED street lighting in Queenscliff and Point Lonsdale at its Ordinary Meeting on Thursday 26 October 2017.

This decision is both financially and environmentally sound. Street lighting is the single largest contributor to electricity use within the Borough of Queenscliffe, generating 206 tonnes of carbon dioxide equivalent in 2016-17. LED technology produces up to 75% less carbon emissions than the mercury vapour lights currently used.

Council pays all operating costs for 325 street lights in the Borough of Queenscliffe, and a further 117 lights, located on declared highways and maintained by VicRoads, are managed in a joint arrangement between Council and VicRoads.

Seven of the 325 Council street lights feature a style of fitting for which there is currently no approved LED equivalent available. Council has been advised that there may be an approved fitting available for these lights in the near future and will continue to pursue a complete transition to LED technology.

Community Environment Alliance Grants now open!

Applications for the 2017-18 Community Environment Alliance Grants Program open on Monday 5 February 2018 and close on Friday 16 March 2018.

The CEA grants support local not-for-profit organisations and groups to reduce carbon emissions and preserve the Borough's natural environment, and will facilitate innovative and creative projects to achieve one or more of the following:

- Support the reduction of energy consumption and greenhouse gas emissions;
- Increase the energy efficiency of community buildings within the municipality;
- Raise community awareness of climate change and the impacts it will have on our environment and way of life;

- Increase recycling at public events;
- Divert waste from landfill;
- Increase community awareness on waste minimisation and correct waste disposal; and / or
- Enable community members to gain new skills in relation to sustainability.

Applications can be made by incorporated not-for-profit organisations whose principal activities are conducted within the Borough of Queenscliffe area, and schools (for noninfrastructure projects only that are separate to the normal school curriculum).

Council and Kinder join forces to launch new toothbrush recycling campaign

The Borough of Queenscliffe Council, in partnership with the Queenscliff Kindergarten, has launched a new program to recycle used toothbrushes, toothpaste tubes and dental floss containers.

A dedicated toothbrush collection point has been set up in the foyer of Council's offices at 50 Learmonth Street, Queenscliff. Residents should ensure toothbrushes are dry and toothpaste tubes and dental floss containers are empty before dropping them in the collection bin. The new toothbrush recycling program complements Council's annual e-waste collection event, the household battery recycling program and the kerbside recycling and green waste bin service, which have lead to significant reductions in the amount of waste sent to landfill.

The toothbrush recycling program is an initiative of the Queenscliff Kindergarten delivered by the Community Environment Alliance. Council's Tourism Rate explained

Council's most recent draft Rating Strategy includes a recommendation that Council continue to apply differential rates, including a Tourism Accommodation Rate that is 10% higher than the general residential property rate.

The Tourism Accommodation Rate applies to any land within the Borough of Queenscliffe that contains a dwelling, unit, cabin, house or part of a house with five or fewer bedrooms that is used, primarily or otherwise, to generate income from the provision of holiday accommodation.

The objective of the tourist accommodation rate is to ensure that smaller tourist accommodation properties make a financial contribution that reflects the cost of additional tourism-related services that Council may provide, such as costs associated with the Queenscliffe Visitor Information Centre service and tourism promotion, construction and maintenance of infrastructure assets, and development and provision of community services and / or general support services. In determining a fair and equitable rate for tourism accommodation properties, Council has also considered the prevalence of tourism-related employment in the Borough of Queenscliffe.

It's important to note that the total rate amount collected by Council each year is not greater because of the application of the Tourism Accommodation Rate. The total rate amount collected remains constant but the proportion collected from general residential properties is marginally reduced, while the proportion collected from tourist accommodation properties and commercial properties is marginally increased. This reflects the capacity of tourist accommodation and commercial properties to generate income, as opposed to general residential properties.

Receive your rates notice by email and save time!

Council has upgraded to a new and improved eNotices system to provide Borough of Queenscliffe ratepayers with a more convenient way to receive rates notices.

The new eNotices system delivers easy sign up, login and account management processes for ratepayers, with the ability to change your email address and contact phone number, add and delete the rates notices that you would like to receive by email, and specify additional email addresses to receive notices at any time.

Using the new eNotices system, rates notices are delivered by email at the beginning of September, November, February and May each year, saving time and paper and ultimately reducing costs for all ratepayers.
