# Message from the Mayor



Council is very excited about the latest news regarding 'Destination Queenscliff', in particular the way this project will contribute to increasing overnight visitation to Queenscliff and attracting more economic activity to support local businesses and employment.

'Destination Queenscliff' seeks to enhance and conserve the Shortlands Bluff area that Council and community recognise as one of the most significant locations in Queenscliff. The project includes improvements to the Ocean View car park, expansion of the parkland adjacent to the car park, a new kiosk / café, new eco-designed tourist accommodation that will be located in the same footprint as the previous houses and buildings on Shortlands Bluff, improvements

to the southern end of Hesse Street and enhancements to the Commonwealth land around the outside of the Fort. This will include pathways and lighting of the wall.

Council has produced a Community Bulletin, included with this edition of your Borough Bites newsletter, to provide the story of the project so far. The Community Bulletin includes a visual representation of the current concept plan, a question and answer section explaining the project's background, an aerial photo from 2011 showing the former lighthouse houses and ancillary buildings that existed on the site and information on next steps. The Community Bulletin also responds to the incorrect information about this project that has been reported in the media.

Council welcomes your ideas and feedback on Destination Queenscliff, and I encourage you to read the Community Bulletin to make sure you have the most up to date and accurate information regarding the project. The Community Bulletin is also available on Council's website and can be collected at Customer Service.

Council was quick to conduct necessary site inspections and referrals to Heritage Victoria and the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning to enable clean up after an abandoned former TocH building at the Point Lonsdale Lighthouse Reserve was destroyed by fire over the Labour Day long weekend.

Following the fire, repairs and modifications were carried out on the barrier fencing to

eliminate unauthorised entry, and additional 'Warning Hazardous Materials Keep Out' signs were placed. Council also engaged a WorkCover licensed Class A asbestos removalist to remove the burnt building debris and topsoil. On site and air monitoring occurred during the work. Anyone with information about vandalism at the site should contact Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

Council is currently working on the draft Business Plan and Budget for the year 2017–18. The process includes a series of Council workshops to review current progress, identify challenges and opportunities, and develop a new set of initiatives and capital projects to meet the Council Plan objectives.

Public meetings will be held in June for people to learn more about the draft Council Plan, Budget and Business Plan for 2017–18. Dates for the public meetings will be advised via public notices in print media and on Council's website www.queenscliffe.vic.gov.au. Public submissions on the draft documents will also form part of the consultation. Further information will be available on Council's website.

#### **Community Grants now open**

Does your community group have a great idea they would like to see happen in the Borough?

Council's Community Development Grants program can help. The Grants Program aims to encourage and assist community organisations to take an active involvement in the life of their community for the benefit of the community and its members, empower communities to become stronger and more economically, environmentally and socially sustainable, enhance leadership and develop a sense of pride, ownership and identity within communities.

To be eligible for a Community Development Grant, your community group must be a notfor-profit organisation that is able to match the grant amount on a dollar for dollar basis, either in cash and / or through in-kind labour and materials, and submit only one application.

Your group's project must be managed through a legal entity such as an incorporated association, be of benefit to Borough of Queenscliffe residents, commence after 1 July 2017 and be completed by 30 June 2018. Multiple project components are permitted.

Grant applications open on Monday 1 May 2017 and close at 4.00pm on Tuesday 6 June 2017.

#### Prepare your e-waste for drop-off

The Borough of Queenscliffe is holding an e-waste drop-off event at the Ocean View car park in Queenscliff on Saturday 13 May from 9.00am to 2.00pm.

E-waste is old, unwanted or broken electronic or electrical equipment. It is produced at up to three times that of normal household waste production, and can contain toxic materials such as lead, mercury, cadmium, hexavalent chromium and brominated fire retardants that are hazardous, difficult to dispose of and potentially damaging to the environment.

E-waste will be collected and recycled by ToxFree. ToxFree's technologies and processes ensure that maximum e-waste recycling and recovery processing takes place in Australia.
