## Council makes great progress on Sport and Recreation Precinct upgrade

## Council continues to make significant progress on the upgrade of the Queenscliff Sport and Recreation Reserve.

While the installation of AFL-standard lighting at the oval has been the highlight of the project to date, a number of other milestones have been reached. These include installation of solar panels to the Monahan Centre, construction of goal netting and completion of civil design works for construction of the carpark, netball courts and cricket nets along with all utilities.

The detailed construction plans for the civil works at the Sport and Recreation Precinct were refined and

completed in close consultation with the Queenscliff Community Sports Club and football, netball and cricket clubs. Planning and vegetation removal permits have been issued and Council has received Coastal Management Act consent for all remaining works.

Following a Special Meeting of Council held on Thursday 12 October, Council has resolved to appoint John Monahan Pty Ltd to complete the civil works. Stay tuned for further updates through your sporting club newsletters, community noticeboards and Council's website, www.queenscliffe.vic.gov.au.

## **Community Grants funding promotes creativity and independence**

The Kindergarten also used the Community Grants funds to purchase wet weather gear for the Kinder Explorers Program that can be re-used in the kinder yard for water and mud play and on local walking excursions.

## National Recycling Week 2017

Borough of Queenscliffe residents are encouraged to think outside the bin and sort through their household waste, batteries and light bulbs during National Recycling Week.

National Recycling Week runs from Monday 13 November to Sunday 19 November this year, and Council is hosting a collection event at the Queenscliff Town Hall from Monday 13 November to Friday 17 November so that residents can drop off the following items:

- Polystyrene packaging (non-commercial quantities)
- Mobile phones, batteries and chargers
- Fluorescent light tubes and compact fluorescent lamps (CFLs)
- Household batteries sizes AAA, AA, C, D, 6 volt, 9 volt and button.

These items cannot be recycled through your kerbside recycling bin. If you have any questions about items that will be accepted during the collection event please contact Council's Sustainability Officer on 5258 1377.

National Recycling Week, founded in 1996, highlights the environmental benefits of re-use and recycling programs, while making participation enjoyable and easy through community events and programs.

Borough of Queenscliffe Mayor Tony Francis was keen to promote this popular environmental event.

"Many people may not realise how best to dispose of some common household items that should not be included in your regular bin service," Cr Francis said.

This is the fourth year Council has hosted the local collection event, which aims to reduce waste to landfill.

"I encourage everyone to make the most of the local drop off event, which will help us to reduce our impact on the local environment together," Cr Francis said.

# State government thunderstorm asthma forecasting service

Following the thunderstorm asthma epidemic that occurred in November 2016, the Department of Health and Human Services has been working with the Bureau of Meteorology, the University of Melbourne, Deakin University and other research organisations to develop an epidemic thunderstorm asthma forecasting system.

"Epidemic thunderstorm asthma events don't happen every year, but they can occur during grass pollen season," said Borough of Queenscliffe Mayor, Councillor Tony Francis.

The forecasting system will be available from 1 October until 31 December. To access the forecasting system, download the Vic Emergency app from www.emergency.vic.gov. au and set up a 'watch zone' for your location to receive advice and warnings about potential epidemic thunderstorm asthma events during the grass pollen season.

The Department of Health and Human Services will also operate a subscription service for the distribution of epidemic thunderstorm asthma forecasts on forecasted high risk days only. To subscribe to this service, visit www2.health.vic.gov.au/newsletters.

The Marine and Fresh Water Discovery Centre and the Borough of Queenscliffe are teaming up with Tangaroa Blue Foundation for an action-inspiring workshop to tackle litter at the source - BEFORE it gets out into our environment.

Join the workshop on Wednesday 6 December from 9.00am to help develop a plan to tackle litter in the Borough.

18,000 pieces of plastic are estimated to float in every square kilometre of ocean and over 75% of what is removed from our beaches is made of plastic. If you are tired of seeing littered coffee cups everywhere and fuming at plastic straws and food packaging left behind in our environment, then this workshop is for you. ## 10 2018 Hard Waste Collection Event

Council will host its annual hard waste collection on Saturday 24 March 2018.

It is important to remember that Council's hard waste collection is for waste that cannot fit in your kerbside rubbish bin and excludes building, renovation or demolition materials (e.g. fences, bricks, concrete, rubble or excavation material). E-waste such as televisions and computer equipment is also excluded. Hard waste items (other than whitegoods) must not weigh more than 32kg, be longer than 1.2m or wider / deeper than o.6m. Please use your kerbside waste and recycling bins for disposal of smaller items. Hard waste in commercial quantities will not be collected.
