Rail Trail upgrades in Queenscliff complete

Upgrade works on Bridge Street in Queenscliff are now complete, making the Rail Trail safer for cyclists and joggers.

The construction of a shared pathway and resurfacing of surrounding roads will provide a safer connection for users accessing the Rail Trail at its Queenscliff terminus, as well as complementing the new wharf currently

under construction. Local residents will also benefit from asphalting works to improve parking arrangements along Bridge Street.

Council has worked collaboratively with residents living near the site to achieve an outcome that suits everybody, and we thank local residents on Bridge Street for their help designing the project.

Boat ramp fees removed at Queenscliff

After months of work, the Borough of Queenscliffe has welcomed the removal of parking fees at the Queenscliff Boat Ramp. With parking fees now no longer being charged, Queenscliff boaters will now be able to enjoy a cheaper day out on the water.

The removal of boat fees comes after extensive discussions between Council and the Victorian Government. Council hopes that the removal of fees will bring more boaters to the region

to enjoy world-class fishing and boating opportunities.

Council has also expressed support for the proposed upgrade of the Queenscliff Boat Ramp, and will be working closely with the Victorian Government to deliver this improvement. We thank the Victorian Government, Minister Jaala Pulford and Member for Bellarine Lisa Neville for funding this important upgrade.

Don't forget your reusable bag

Residents of the Borough of Queenscliffe have long been environmentally-minded, particularly when it comes to reusable bags. Point Lonsdale IGA was well ahead of the curve when it stopped offering lightweight single-use plastic bags way back in 2011, and the local community quickly developed sustainable habits.

Fast forward to now, and lightweight single-use plastic bags are officially a thing of the past. From 1 November 2019, all lightweight shopping bags with a thickness below 36 microns – including degradable, biodegradable and compostable bags – will be banned throughout retailers in Victoria. This applies to supermarkets, corner stores, community markets, small businesses, and any other retailer you can think of.

Sustainability Victoria is reminding everyone to remember four things when they leave the house: bag, wallet, keys, and phone. For more information on the bag ban and developing better bag habits visit their website.

War-time history restored at Point Lonsdale structure

A historic World War I searchlight emplacement in Point Lonsdale has recently reopened after being restored by the Borough of Queenscliffe. Mayor Bob Merriman and Minister for Water, Police and Emergency Services Lisa Neville opened the site, encouraging residents and visitors to learn more about the town's rich maritime and military history.

The concrete emplacement was originally constructed in 1914 but fell into disrepair due

to its age and location, and was closed to the public last year among safety concerns. Now this important reminder of a bygone era is on display once more, housing more than a century of memories inside it.

The area has long been associated with naval history, and navigational structures have been in place at Point Lonsdale since 1863. The outbreak of the First World War prompted moves to install defence structures in the vicinity of the lighthouse, of which this is one.

Council allocated \$86,000 towards the project,

which was supplemented by a Heritage Victoria grant of \$90,000 under the Living Heritage Grants Program. The project included rehabilitation of the structure, safe public access and interpretation signage. A timber stairwell now also provides a direct link between the beach and the structure, which hosts sweeping views across Port Phillip and the infamous rip.

Council thanks the Victorian Government, local community members and everyone else who has played a part in the site's restoration for their efforts.

OMF sells out

The Queenscliff Music Festival has sold out its 2019 line-up nearly two months in advance, the earliest the festival has done so in its 23-year history. Thousands of music lovers will venture down to Queenscliff on the last weekend in November to take in some of the best blues, roots and rock artists from across Australia and the globe.

Headliners over the three-day festival include Tim Finn, Missy Higgins, The Cat Empire, Clare Bowditch, and Troy Cassar-Daley.
